3.	Public Participation (15 minutes): Japanese Knotweed: The issue hasn't been sorted out after 6 months. The Groundman has organised a quote but the Housing Department hasn't approved the work to be carried out. Ted Boatman is totally dissatisfied with the lack of action from the District Council. Flooding by Pandemonium: The water is very bad and there has been one accident. To be chased up with ECC and residents asked to report on the ECC website. 50mph Howlett End: 30 mph sign needs to be replaced. The 30mph is supposed to start at the Old Star and they are at the Steam Yard. Speedwatch: Deryck Johnson explained that isn't a strict timetable and there are adhoc checks. In 55 mins booked 21 cars last week. There are two more people to join the speedwatch team from Carver Barracks. Deryck Johnson was with a traffic officer and he has promised to make some visits. Saffron Walden Police has visited the site and had the Truecam and will be making more visits.

Wimbish is considered to be a large village and given 115 houses to be built. County Councillor report: Not present

The mobile dwelling was on site between June 2019 and November 2022 solely due to the prolonged duration of the build of the new dwelling, and therefore this period of time should not qualify for a Certificate of Lawful Development.

- e) Local Plan: Regulations 18 1st stage for a 6 week public consultation and next stage is Reg 19 and consultation. Members of the PC that attended the Local Plan meeting reported that the main report was 400 pages and supplementary report 3,900 pages.

UDC need to build 13,860 houses, there are already 6,000 houses committed. Takeley and Saffron Walden will take a lot of the houses.

13 large villages to take 1,000 houses between them. 115 houses have been allocated for Elder Street (Wimbish) which will be an 36% increase for Wimbish. All the development is on the Tesco side of Sewards End.

The PC would like to query why Wimbish is a large village with UDC and that 115 houses have been allocated for Elder Street, but no location is known.

The PC agreed it is very important to protect the land between Rowney Wood and the Airfield.

The Clerk will ask UDC to clarify the classification of a larger village and the location of the 115 houses to be allocated to Wimbish.
